We request that each age group have their own workshop to ensure developmentallyappropriate practices.

Workshop Description

This workshop with Master Teacher and Storyteller Susansylvia Scott is customized, with an innovative approach, to eliminate writer's block in Creative Writing classes through utilization of visualization as opposed to "thinking". Susansylvia uses the participation and interaction of students to heighten involvement. The workshop will stimulate writing and language skills through imaginative participation. Stories will be created in the moment.

Active learning and freeing up the creative mind are the trademarks of this workshop. Creative exercises nurture the skills of imagining, listening, and active participation. Students enhance their ability to prepare and tell a story. This workshop is an exciting adventure!

Vocabulary

Creative Writing: To be the author or composer of stories, poes or articles.

Visualization: Picturing something in the mind. Often done while reading.

Writer's block: When the act of writing is blocked in the mind. The person cannot think of anything to write.

Linear Thinking: Left brain, straight line, organized style of thinking that

is not creative.

Picturing: Using the imagination to visualize or "see" something in the mind.

Imagination: The ability to make pictures in the mind, including new images or ideas you have not experienced.

Writing Method: A chosen or systematic way of writing, such as picturing or creative thinking.

Post-Workshop Activities

- 1. Write, using purely the visualizing method for any form of writing, fact or fiction or anything in between. Remember: all writing is creative!
- 2. If the students go back into writer's block, circle them up and begin asking, "What is your setting?", "What do you see there". Go back to visualization to open the creative mind.
- 3. Have the students write a short play and then act the play out.
